Our Vision

"The Cool Coalition is a global network connecting over 100 partners to facilitate knowledge exchange, advocacy and joint action towards a rapid transition to efficient and climate-friendly cooling using a comprehensive approach.

Comprehensive action is required to <u>reduce</u> the need for mechanical cooling, <u>shift</u> to cooling with lower emissions including by using renewable energy, <u>improve</u> cooling efficiency, and <u>protect</u> those most vulnerable from a lack of cooling.

The aim is to raise climate ambition in the context of the SDGs, the Kigali Amendment to the Montreal Protocol, and the Paris Climate Agreement."









Together we achieved to raise the profile of cooling in the international agenda. The Cool Coalition became an official outcome of the Climate Action Summit and is working closely with UNFCCC Marrakech Partnership for Global Climate Action and contributing to the 2030 Agenda and Kigali amendment.



Since its inception, Cool Coalition members have launched 9 working groups on key transformational topics for the cooling sector:

- National Cooling Action Plans
- Pathway to Net Zero
- Used Products Imports to Africa
- Private Sector Mobilization
- Sustainable Cold Chains

- Urban Cooling
- Renewable Energy Cooling
- Nature Based Solutions for Cooling
- Multilateral Development Banks Informal Dialogue on Sustainable Cooling.







The National Cooling Action Plans working group led by K-CEP developed a comprehensive NCAP methodology with by Cool Coalition secretariat, AEEE, UN ESCAP that integrates the experience of members, including SEforALL's needs assessment.

Cambodia and Indonesia are developing NCAPs using the methodology developed by the Cool Coalition working group.



RMI, the Global Covenant of Mayors, UNEP, K-CEP and Mission Innovation are developing a sustainable cooling handbook for cities under the Urban Cooling working group, incorporating intervention strategies and supporting case studies that can be readily implemented at the city or district level within a city.



Members pilot projects contribute to the Cool Coalition, including on sustainable cold chains and urban cooling in India to contribute to the implementation of ICAP, an urban cooling project in Vietnam that will contribute to enhanced NDC objectives, as well as passive cooling in Cambodia.

Country members have enhanced their commitments to sustainable cooling:

- Viet Nam has **officially joined** the Cool Coalition as the 23rd country member
- 14 countries around the world have committed to including cooling in their NDC
 - Viet Nam, Ethiopia, Cambodia, Nigeria, Ghana, Dominican Republic, Barbados, Saint Lucia, Jordan, Burkina Faso, Pakistan, Morocco, Chile, Tunisia
- Cambodia and Indonesia are now developing their **NCAP** using the Cool Coalition methodology

Countries are working with Cool Coalition members to demonstrate new approaches in under-addressed areas:

- Rwanda and India on integrated sustainable cold chain solutions
- Cambodia on passive cooling solutions
- Vietnam on urban cooling
- Colombia on district cooling
- Burkina Faso on social housing and appliances











Together, we have organized 15 high-level and technical events, reached a cumulative audience of over 6000 people with Champions mobilizing new members and commitments

We participated to countless more events to ensure sustainable cooling is included in key discussions about climate finance, energy and decarbonization planning, buildings designs and urban resilience, green recovery strategies, and COP26





















Pathway to zero GHG emissions for the cooling sector launched as a collaboration between K-CEP, Cool Coalition, Carbon Trust and COP26 High-Level Champions.

Cool Coalition members are closely collaborating with the COP26 Champions team to raise awareness, mobilize commitments and have created supporting tools to accelerate the Race To Zero, including a Net-Zero Action Table, a Cool Calculator and a Net-Zero Products Guide.

The Cool Coalition is actively contributing to the preparation of 2021 high-level global meetings:

- UN Food Systems Summit
- Regional Climate Weeks
- High-Level Dialogue on Energy
- the mobilization towards G20
- the mobilization for COP26
















