## The Programme

Beat the Heat is a flagship implementation drive of the Brazilian Presidency of COP30 and the UNEP-led Cool Coalition, engaging close to 250 cities and over 100 partners to accelerate local solutions for extreme heat and sustainable cooling.

The Beat the Heat Training and Study Tour, co-hosted by Singapore and the UNEP-led Cool Coalition, is one of the first opportunities for participating cities to meet in person, exchange experiences, and learn practical approaches for implementing these commitments. Through expert discussions and site visits, participants will explore Singapore's experience in heat governance, urban cooling, and climate-resilient urban development while strengthening peer learning and collaboration across the Beat the Heat community.

### Objectives

- Strengthen understanding of integrated approaches to urban heat resilience — policy, governance, planning, financing and implementation.
- Build practical knowledge of the three Beat the Heat commitments: heat assessments, nature-based cooling, and sustainable cooling technologies.
- Facilitate peer learning across cities, countries and partners, drawing on Singapore's experience.
